INSTALLATION

Installing Driver@ Parallel Lines

Insert the game disc into your DVD drive. If you have enabled the Autorun option, the game installation will start automatically. Otherwise, double-click on the DVD-ROM icon in the My Computer menu. Find Autorun.exe in the list of files and folders and double-click on it to start the installation process. Select "Install" to run the installation and follow the installation wizard guide to successfully install the game on your computer.

Uninstalling Driver Parallel Lines

Either click on the uninstall icon in the game folder inside the Start menu or select Windows Control Panel and use the Add or Remove Program or Program Installation option.

MAIN MENU

CREATING A PROFILE

When a new game starts you will be asked to create a profile. This will be used to save your game progress.

You can create and use additional profiles if you wish, or delete ones that you no longer require using the Profiles option in the Pause menu.

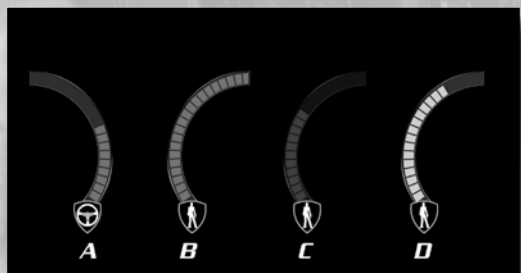
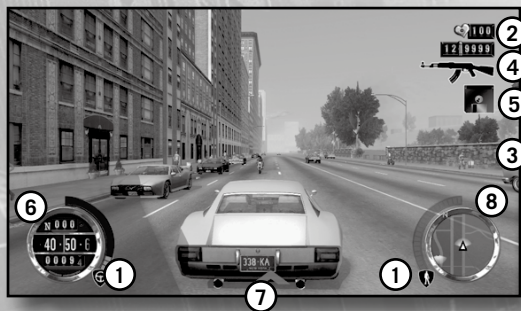

Prove you got the guts to do what it takes, TK, and the city is all yours ...

GAME SCREEN



1. Felony Display:

- If a cop sees or hears you commit a felony while you are in a vehicle, it will be attributed to that vehicle. The felony bar increases while you continue to commit crimes, as does the aggression of any pursuing cops.
- If cops see you exiting the car, the felony will transfer to TK himself, but if they don't, it remains on the vehicle only.
- If TK acquires a felony while on foot, he can cover his tracks by getting into a "clean" vehicle when the cops aren't watching. The cops will have trouble recognizing TK, and his personal felony will be greyed out while he remains in a clean car.
- When your personal felony status is hidden you can still accumulate felonies on your current vehicle. Don't stay close to cops for too long, though, especially if you are on a bike, as they may become suspicious. The felony bars will start filling up yellow, and eventually your cover will be blown. To get rid of your current vehicle's felony, you will need to call in to one of the garages. A visit to the safe house or garage will also clear your personal felony.

2. Health: Shows your current health level. Collect health packs to restore this value. If TK's health reaches zero he will die. If you are currently on a job, you will be offered the chance to restart from an earlier checkpoint. You can also load a previously saved game through the Pause menu.

3. Messages: Keep you posted on what you need to do next.

4. Current Weapon and Ammo: Your currently selected weapon with the amount of ammunition left.

5. Auto Save: Appears whenever Driver: Parallel Lines is saving your progress.

6. Speedometer: Shows current speed along with the amount of nitro you have available and the number of miles traveled.

7. Tail Markers: Show the location of tailing cops and goons. The intensity of the markers indicates how close they are.

8. Mini-Map: Shows the roads in your immediate area, and marks locations and points of interest. Markers that are farther away than the current mini-map range may be shown on the outer edge.

PAUSE MENU



You can pause the game and access the Pause menu at any time by pressing the Esc key.

- **Back to Game:** Return to the current game.
- **Restart:** Restarts the game at your last save point. Your current progress will be lost. Restarting the game during an assignment will return you to its start.
- **Profiles:** Load, save, or delete a profile.
- **Options:** Configure settings for controls, game, display, audio, or any cheats you may earn.
- **Stats:** Review your game progression.
- **Back to Main Menu:** Return to the Main Menu.

MAP



You can pause the game and access the map at any time by pressing the Tab key.

The map allows you to review the opportunities open to you. If you are already employed on a job, the current objectives will be shown instead. Use the W and S keys to browse through the available opportunities. You can instantly reach an opportunity by highlighting it and pressing the T key. This is not always possible, however.

You can pan the Map by moving the mouse. You can zoom in or out using the mouse wheel or rotate by holding the right mouse button while moving the mouse.

SHOOTING

You start the game unarmed, but as you progress through the storyline you will be given access to more and better weaponry.

- **Preferred Weapon:** You can carry many different weapons and types of ammo. To change weapons, scroll the mouse wheel.
- **Auto-Lock:** If you click the right mouse button, a targeting reticle appears and moves to the nearest and most central enemy. If there are no enemies currently available, it may lock on to pedestrians or destructible objects. Once you have a lock you can change it to another target by clicking the right mouse button again.
- **Driving and Shooting:** While you are driving, you can click the left mouse button and TK will lean out of the window, ready to shoot. Press the F key and he will return to normal driving position.
- **On-Foot Combat:** Click the left mouse button to fire straight ahead, or click the right mouse button to acquire a target before shooting. To strafe, hold down the right mouse button and move using the W/A/S/D keys. Press the F key to put your weapon away. Press the middle mouse button to aim your weapon more precisely, using the mouse.

SIDE JOBS

If you need to earn some money so that you can improve or repair your ride, you'll be able to find several different types of side jobs around the city, including street or circuit races, repossession contracts, debt collections, or even assassinations. New York's a big place, though, and you might need a little help getting around; choose the Relocate option from within Ray's Autos to shift your base of operations.

VEHICLES



There are many different vehicles in the game. You can collect them by bringing them to one of the garages. Some vehicles can only be found in certain parts of the city; some are even hidden, or found only in particular assignments. You may only keep one version of each type of vehicle. Once brought back to your garage, vehicles can be modified, improved, and tested on a special track. Once in the test run, press the Esc key and select Tune Parts to modify each bought piece of the vehicle. Ray doesn't work for free, though.



While you're cruising the streets, sooner or later you're bound to lock bumpers with your fellow travelers. If you damage your vehicle it will begin to smoke, and its performance will be impaired. If your vehicle takes too much abuse it will catch fire and explode – make sure you aren't nearby when it does!

If you abandon your ride Ray will send a truck out to recover it for you. He'll salvage even the most wrecked vehicles, although you'll still have to pay to have them restored to showroom-ready condition.

MEET THE CHARACTERS



Ray: TK's idol. It was Ray who first taught TK to drive, back home on the farm. It was Ray – good-looking, good-natured Ray – who always had the girls after him. Ray's five years older than TK; he came to New York as soon as he could afford the gas to get here and set up a repair shop in Queens as cover for a car-ringing outfit.



Slink: Smooth and superfly, he lives to party, be the center of attention, tell all the stories, and make everyone laugh. Slink's always been good at providing his clients with whatever they want – hot ladies, good booze, great sounds – but he's also developed an ability to find other things: guns, explosives, cars.



The Mexican: Big in every sense. He loves life, partying, girls, drink, drugs, guns, bikes, cars, and adrenaline highs. He wants to be the center of attention – right in the thick of the action. Tired of the small-time, he sees New York as the place to be to strike it big and take his chance to surf the tidal wave of drug money.



Bishop: Hard, professional, greedy, and cunning – a loner who has trouble trusting anyone other than himself. After three tours in Nam, he's come home with new attitudes about his mind and body. Bishop is a guy who nurtures a carefully controlled ambition, together with a passion for killing and destruction.



Candy: Obsessed with details, he's the best planner in the business. He'll work night and day figuring out the stats, the timing, the people, the weights, the distances. He thinks of everything. With Candy you get the best, but you also get the worst – apart from the body odor, Candy just never stops moaning.



Corrigan: The leader of the gang, Corrigan is a totally commanding presence who knows he's destined for great things. Relaxed, upbeat, super-confident, and charming – people just can't help opening up to Corrigan. He's got a great smile and you trust him from the word go, but behind the smile is an amoral, ruthless man.

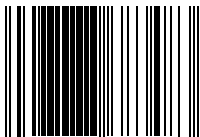
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
